**Subject:** BIRD AWARE SOLENT SITE SPECIFIC FUNDING

### SUMMARY

The report to Joint Committee will seek endorsement from the Joint Committee for the Bird Aware Partnership's recommendations for how site-specific funding should be allocated for the years 2024/5 and 2025/6.

### RECOMMENDATION

It is RECOMMENDED that the Overview and Scrutiny Committee:-

- a) NOTES the contents of this report;
- b) NOTES that Joint Committee will be asked to NOTE and ENDORSE the Bird Aware Partnership's proposed allocation of funding for site specific projects;

## Background

1. The Bird Aware Strategy includes support for site-specific projects to deliver mitigation measures. There is an annual allocation of £400k for this work and monitoring the effectiveness of it.
2. Earlier this year, all partners were invited to prepare and submit project proposals for this funding and a 'site-specific projects' sub-group has scored the proposals that came forward.
3. This project group comprises the Partnership Manager together with a senior ranger, the Monitoring Officer, representatives from Natural England, the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust, the RSPB and a local planning authority. Projects are scored under the following criteria:

4. The scores were presented to the Project Board which considered them in detail. The information in Table 1 represents what the Project Board were prepared to offer support for.

## Projects received

5. The Partnership received bids for fourteen proposed projects, in total requesting £751,834 of funding. These bids contained a good spread of project type and size as well as representing a good geographical spread.
6. As agreed previously, the Site-specific Project Team were seeking to allocate £720,000 over a two-year period (the remainder of the £80k used to fund the Monitoring Officer who evaluates the delivery and impact of the projects). Members of the Project Team individually reviewed and scored the projects against the agreed categories (see paragraph 3), then met to compare results and seek a consensus for a final score for each project.
7. During the screening and scoring process, three bids were considered to fall outside the remit of Bird Aware and therefore cannot be supported by this funding stream and have not been scored. This is not intended as a reflection on the worthiness of these proposals, but does reflect the focus of our work.
8. The scores given have then been used to prioritise the funding recommendations which are outlined below in **Table 1** and presented in full in the agreed scoring sheet circulated with this report.
